Psychosocial Barriers to
Return to Work**

This workshop focuses on empowering you with an understanding of the most common and most detrimental psychosocial barriers faced by workers in their return to work following injury.

By understanding these barriers well, you can be proactive in identifying early 'flags' and help to proactively steer the return to work process to a successful and barrier-free conclusion.

Participants will leave with practical strategies, along with an *Initial Needs Assessment Tool* – this is invaluable in guiding effective communication with the injured worker in the first weeks following injury when unhelpful barriers to RTW are most likely to arise.

Psychosocial Claims – Skills
for Effective Management**

Workers with psychological injury claims have needs and issues quite distinct from physical injury claims, yet these are commonly managed in the same way, often with poor results.

This workshop will empower participants with a good understanding of the needs of workers with psychological injuries in their return to work.

Participants will also leave with practical strategies for early intervention as soon as a worker reports a psychological injury, as well as strategies throughout the 'life' of the claim to optimise the worker's safe, timely and durable return to work.

Separating the Issues –
Workers Compensation
versus Performance
Management**

Employers can feel lost at sea when it comes to managing performance issues with an injured worker. The line between workers compensation issues and performance management and industrial relations issues can often feel blurred, and this leads to poor decisions or poorly managed problems.

Participants will leave with a clear understanding of how to draw a clear and confident line between workers compensation/RTW and performance management/IR issues.

Practical management strategies will be achieved through active discussion, problem solving and debating on case studies within a supportive group environment.
